
OHS Wrestling Welcomes Coach Barrientos Back

Coach Ben Barrientos has returned to Oakland High to rebuild the wrestling program. When Ben Barrientos was the wrestling coach in the 1990s, Oakland High was a dominant team in the OAL, winning many team championships; one year Wildcat wrestlers won10 of the 13 Gold Medals at the OAL section championship. Several OHS wrestlers won their weight four straight years, Jeremiah Captain and Earl Harris being two who accomplished that feat. Oakland High was also the first (and last) team to have a female wrestler qualify for the CIF State Tournament.

Coach Barrientos has returned to Oakland High to rebuild the wrestling program and is asking for support and help from "any quarter I can get it. I left OHS [in the 1990s] with warmups, singlets earguards for 26. In my absence all is gone, I am left with 2 earguards and six singlet's, no warm ups." 
Wildcats in the News

Julia Morgan Receives Award



The WAA recently learned that Julia Morgan (OHS 1890) was awarded the American Institute of Architect's 2014 Gold Medal, the top honor an American architect can receive. She is the first woman to receive the honor; it comes 56 years after her death.

Morgan is probably known best as the architect of Hearst Castle at San Simeon, California. She designed over 700 buildings during her career. Some of her buildings in the Bay Area include the former Webster Street Oakland YWCA (now the Envision Academy of Art), Berkeley City Club (formerly Berkeley Woman's City Club), the College Avenue Presbyterian Church, the former St. John's Church (now known as the Julia Morgan Theater), and several buildings on the University of California campus. She also oversaw the restoration of San Francisco's Fairmont Hotel after the 1906 earthquake.



Alumna Ha Kiet Chau, who as a student at Oakland High wrote for and helped edit Oakland Leaves Magazine, has just published a book of poems Woman Come Undone. Since graduation Ha has continued to write poetry and has been nominated for awards including Best New Poets (Ploughshares, 2011) and Best of the Net (Flutter Poetry Journal, 2012). Woman Come Undone explores the experience of women from many perspectives, including that of women in Vietnam during the 1970s war, which Ha's mother endured before coming to the United States. Ha's imagery can be painfully rich as in the poem "A Woman's Warfare:"

Ha Chau Published

Death fights for the fast pulse on my wrist, for the eight-month fetus in my belly. Our bodies run for a nearby underground tunnel, our single escape. We hide like timorous red crabs under protective shells, as mature men beg for a mercy they rightfully deserve, for a more lenient peace.

It can also be languorously sensual as in "Sharp Point of Rapture" where she writes about the collaboration between the poet and her pen:

we go back to what we do best, the pleasure of words mounting and breaking, lining straight, in conjunction to one another. The rearranging of phrases by candlelight, a very sensual process.
