Wildcats Football 2012

Coach Jayce Goree (OHS'59) is fielding a young football team this year. With only three returning seniors, the team is mostly sophomores and juniors. Twenty-three are playing varsity for the first time. Coach Goree says this is the second year of the rebuilding program and that the Wildcats are "in a better place than last year." He hopes the young team knows how to play and what to do by the end of the pre-season. Two players Goree will be counting on are Senior Cliff Goodwin, returning guard who should be a big help on the line, and Junior Tyler Reynolds, energetic running back and linebacker who wants to compete and win.

Goree's overall expectations for the year are for the team "to consistently improve each game, get better, be more consistent, and to learn to play fast and physical --- to give 110% all the time."

As of this writing, the Varsity has a record of 2 - 1, defeating Tracy's Millenium High and Mt. Eden, but losing to Tennyson.


Alumni Plaza on Campus

This year, for the first time in quite a while, Oakland High students will have to stay on campus during lunch. As part of the modifications made to the building and campus to create adequate facilities for serving 1600 hungry souls in less than an hour, the architect firm created Alumni Plaza. The intent is to give students a nice place to eat and become aware of some noted OHS alumni who are part of the history of the school. The new plaza is located between the gym and the outside basketball courts. There is an arbor, a couple of low walls to sit on, and bricks in the ground with the names, class year and accomplishment of fourteen alumni.

Alumni noted are Henry A. Melvin (1884), Lloyd Moseby (1977), Armand Mauss (1946), Lee Gum Hong (1931), Nellie Wong (1952), Jack London, Lillian Moeller Gilbreth (1896), Yōsuke Matsuoka (1896), Jackie Jensen (1945), George C. Pardee (1875), Stanley Mazor (1959), Gertrude Stein, Chick Gandil, Julia Morgan (1890). Three attended but did not graduate from Oakland High.

The most recent alumni honored in the Alumni Plaza is Lloyd Moseby ('77), base stealer legend for the Toronto Blue Jays in the 1980s. Catch up on what Lloyd is doing in this interview from August, 2012.
